Youth Conference Honour Code Statement

As a matter of personal commitment, participants are expected to demonstrate in daily living those moral virtues encompassed in the gospel of Jesus Christ, and will:

- Be honest
- Live a chaste and virtuous life
- Obey the law and all campus policies
- Use clean language
- Respect others
- Keep the word of wisdom
- Observe dress and appearance standards
- Encourage others in their commitment to comply

Dress and Appearance for Young Men

Young men are expected to be clean shaven; moustaches and beards of any shape or size are not acceptable. Ponytails, pigtails, braids, designs, carvings, completely shaved heads, unnatural hair colour, and any type of extreme or distracting style are not permitted. Sideburns should not extend below the earlobe or onto the cheek. Body piercing of any type is not allowed.

Casual Dress Explained

The following items of clothing are considered appropriate for *Casual Dress*: blue jeans, blue jean jackets, cargo-style trousers, trainers, hiking or work boots, flip-flops, casual T-shirts, and brightly coloured clothing.

Best Dress Explained

A collared dress shirt (white or coloured) that buttons down the front should be worn. Less formal ties are considered appropriate for the final dance. Shirttails should always be tucked inside the trousers. Young men should wear smart trousers or suit trousers with dress shoes.

Sunday Dress Explained

There will be activities throughout the week where *Sunday Dress* clothing will be required. Conservative or missionary-style clothing is always considered appropriate as *Sunday Dress*. A white collared dress shirt that buttons down the front (shirttails should always be tucked in), a conservative tie, and suit trousers with dress shoes should be worn.

Dress and Appearance for Young Women

Young women should wear clothing that covers the shoulder, and should avoid clothing that is low-cut in the front or the back, or revealing in any other manner. If blouses or shirts do not assure modesty, then an undershirt must be worn underneath. Dresses and skirts must be knee length or longer. Slits in dresses and skirts must not extend above the knee. Dresses with spaghetti straps are not permitted unless a nice shirt or blouse is worn underneath.

Unacceptable clothing includes anything sleeveless, strapless, backless, or immodest. Hairstyles should be clean and neat with no extreme styles or unnatural colours. Excessive ear piercing (more than one per ear) and all other body piercing are unacceptable.

Casual Dress Explained

The following items of clothing are considered appropriate for *Casual Dress*: blue jeans, blue jean jackets and skirts, cargo-style trousers, trainers, hiking or work boots, flip-flops, casual T-shirts, and brightly coloured clothing.

Best Dress Explained

Smart trousers, dresses, and skirts which are knee-length or longer are appropriate *Best Dress* clothing. Slits in dresses and skirts must not extend above the knee.

Sunday Dress Explained

There will be activities throughout the week where *Sunday Dress* clothing will be required. Conservative or missionary-style clothing is always considered appropriate as *Sunday Dress*. *Sunday Dress* clothing should not be mixed with clothing otherwise defined as *Casual Dress*. Blouses must be modest in fit, extend below the waistline, and be long enough to cover the stomach and lower back, especially when bending over or raising hands or arms. If blouses do not meet the approved length, undershirts must be worn to assure modesty. Sleeves must cover the shoulders.
